

## Widow's Claim for Pension

Rachel K. COOPER, age 39, of Cincinnati (Hamilton County) Ohio appeared in Probate Court on 29 July 1863 "in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress approved July 14, 1862." She stated that she was the widow of Enos COOPER who was a corporal in company L, commanded by Captain Thompson, in the 4<sup>th</sup> Regiment of Ohio Cavalry, commanded by Colonel Eli Long, in the war of 1861. That her husband died at Murfreesboro, in the State of Tennessee, on the 26<sup>th</sup> day of June, 1863 in the Military Hospital of Typhoid fever and of a gun shot wound received in a skirmish with the enemy on the --- while in the line of duty in the service of the United States. She further declares that she was married to the said Enos COOPER at Covington, Kentucky, on the 11<sup>th</sup> of January 1844 by James Arnold, a Justice of the Peace; that her name before her marriage was Rachel K. COOPER, and that ever since the death of her said husband, she has remained a widow: as will more fully appear by reference to the proof annexed. The marriage certificate is filed in the Second Auditors office of the Treasury Department. (No children listed as being under age of sixteen. Rachel signed all of the papers with an "x".)

"This is to certify that Enos M. COOPER, of Cincinnati, Hamilton Co., Ohio, enlisted in Comp. L, 4<sup>th</sup> Ohio Volunteer Cavalry, on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of August 1862. He was wounded in battle May 21<sup>st</sup> 1863, was taken into the Field or Camp Hospital at Murfreesboro, Tennessee, where Typhoid fever set in, and he died June 26<sup>th</sup> 1863, aged 44 years and 10 mos.

Enos M. COOPER - at the time of his death had but two children - one aged 19 years the other 16 years of age - and none under 16.
